S.A.R.P. Mentorship Program



- This program matches Professional and Student S.A.R.P. members for a 5-month Mentorship Program.
- The goal of the Mentorship Program is to match students (protégés) with mentors who are employed in an area of recreation services chosen by the student.
- The main focus for this program is the career development for the mentor as well as career awareness for the student.

What's your commitment?



- You will attend an in-person welcome interaction with all the participants.
- You will create a plan with your mentor, including 3 meeting/observation times per month and 3 specific goals for your 5 months together.
- You will be contacted twice during the year to monitor the progress of your match.
- You will attend a reception at the conclusion of your experience.
- Extra communication/engagement is recommended (attend conferences, networking events, etc.).
- You will be encouraged to submit a short description of your experience.



The Post-Secondary Institution will:

- Promote the S.A.R.P. Mentorship Program to Students (emails, in-class announcements, social media, word of mouth, etc.).
- Host an information session for the Mentorship Program.
- Provide a facility for the two in-person interactions.



The Saskatchewan Association of Recreation Professionals will:



- Attend and lead a student information session at the post-secondary institution to share details of the Mentorship Program.
- Collect applications, select 10 students, and match them with S.A.R.P. Professionals in the provincial community.
- Plan and facilitate two in-person interactions for all participants.
- Contact mentors/students twice during the year to monitor the progress of the match.

Students entering the second year of their post secondary program
